"*It still doesn't feel real*", she said, and as the days have gone on and she waited for her CAO offer, she has resolved to "*looking forward*", with Jordan Ahern saying there were "*phone calls all over the place*" once he realised he had achieved the grades he wanted.

No matter what results students were aiming for, there is something useful in the approach of "trying to understand what you're learning, then you start making connections", a great tip offered by Julia.

Finally, when reflecting on their time in Kishoge and if they'd do anything differently, or indeed if they had any further advice for current Leaving Cert. students, the idea of *"surrounding yourself with people who believe in you"* and *"believing in yourself"* was one that was noted across the board.
