A portfolio of our work was assessed by the PDST (Professional Development Service for Teachers) and the results were announced this week. The Great Reads Awards, 2020



October saw the formation of our first junior and senior reading groups. Students from both these groups are reading their way through a selection of five great titles that have been shortlisted for the Great Read Awards, 2020. The titles are from emerging Irish authors and students will have their vote on which authors they feel deserve to win. In addition, we have set up our first virtual libraries, accessible to all students on OneNote. These libraries currently replace our Reading Room which we had to temporarily close due to Covid health and safety precautions.

Banned Books Month

November saw the continuation of our annual Banned Books Month. Students created an assembly to share their views on Banned Books and celebrate our freedom to read books that have been censored or banned in other countries. In addition, the Student Leadership Team launched the SLT Annual Writing Competition - the theme of which was "Taboo Topics". Entries were submitted on subjects that align with our SPHE and Ethical Ed curriculum but are often underrepresented in popular literature - mental health, LGBTQI+ issues, the environment among others. Competition was tough, with lots of exceptional entries. Winners and honourable mentions were as follows: Lili Feher, Jake Murray-McGuirk and Aishat Kassim. Highly commended work came from: Pakeeza Younas, Eva Zafar, Sarah O' Brien, Kacey Kennedy and Mahnoor Hassan. Well done to all involved!
